

## Grade 1 News


Wow...where did September go?

Grade 1 has been exceptionally busy this past month. We have been learning the rules of the school and the classroom, and we are getting there, slowly, but surely. It is always a difficult adjustment for 5 and 6 year olds to come to school every day, ALL day! It can be tiring in the beginning.



We are working hard on reviewing and learning our letters and sounds, and then trying to put that into our reading. We have concentrated mostly on the short vowel sound of /a/ as in the word “cat”. We are now moving into the short /i/ sound as in the word “in”.

In Math, we are Pattern Superstars! We have already learned how to name patterns and how to continue them.



In Science, we are continuing to learn about the Seasons and the weather that goes along with the particular seasons.

In Social Studies, we are learning about Geography, and the tools that help us find places.

Physical Education sees us getting outside and playing SAFELY in spaces. We are taking advantage of the nice weather as much as we can, as well as being out in the fresh air.



I would like to thank you all for sharing your incredible kids with me. We also appreciate everyone keeping their children home when they are not feeling well. It is helping keep everyone safe.



Welcome back to all of the returning Grade 2 students. During September we have been busy establishing classroom routines and expectations and all of the children are doing a fantastic job remembering them. In Language Arts we have been working on reading comprehension, making words activities, and printing. We will continue to write our spelling words in our agenda and I really appreciate it if everyone can continue practicing them at home. It really does help! We have also been completing writing assignments that involve getting to know each of the grade 2 students better.

In Math, we have been working on Number Sense activities that use numbers from 1-20. We have also started completing a daily math minute drill that tests each student's ability to add digits quickly and accurately in a specific amount of time.

We will soon be finishing up our unit in Science on magnets and the students really have enjoyed the "hands on" activities.



Finally, in Social Studies we will begin learning unique and interesting things about the following three Canadian cities: Iqaluit, Saskatoon and Meteghan.

Thank you to all the parents who have been signing their child's agenda and checking the front pocket for important information. It is greatly appreciated. ## Grade 3 News

Welcome Fall! We have 22 students in grade 3 this year and I am looking forward to a lot of learning and fun with this group! Welcome to Jenine, Rylan and Arlo, who are new to DDS!

In Language Arts we are setting a goal of making this our best reading year yet! We are learning about how to choose books that are just right for us, adding strategies to our reader's toolboxes, and exploring a variety of books in our classroom library. Throughout the year we will be working in some guided reading groups to focus on building reading strategies and practicing them with support. Students will also have daily reading time where they can choose books that they are interested in so they can continue practicing those strategies!



We are starting our writing this year with personal narratives. Students are writing daily and I have been so impressed with how much more they are writing, even after only a month! I love how they are sharing stories that are important to them and also how they are genuinely trying different writing techniques that we are noticing in mentor texts. We are working on being storytellers instead of news reporters so our goal is to write step by step, "showing" what is happening instead of "telling". This helps our readers to make a mental movie of our writing!

In math during the first month of school we did some review of addition strategies. The unit we are currently on is patterns and in grade 3 students learn about increasing and decreasing patterns: how to make, compare and extend them.

Our current science unit is Rocks and Minerals so students are finding many interesting rocks that we are sharing. We are also using different rock properties to compare and sort them. The 3 types of rocks that we learn about in this unit are sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic rocks.

We are starting social studies with a unit on our community, our province and our country, so we can compare and contrast our experiences with those in the other countries we study throughout the year.

-Just a reminder that our library class is every THURSDAY so please remind your child to bring back his / her library books for that day.



## **Mrs. Fraser (Grade 4) - September Newsletter**

I'm so excited to be back in the classroom with the students! We have had an exciting month and been very busy learning back to school routines and Covid protocols and procedures. We've had a successful month of learning and it's shaping up to be a great year!

### **Language Arts / Reading**



We have been reading two novels aloud

- Cam Jansen and the Barking Treasure Mystery
- Tales of A Fourth Grade Nothing.

Students have been participating in Reading Response and comprehension questions aligned with the novels.

### **Writing**

We have written some personal narrative about their back to school experience as well as completed some creative student choice assignments linked to their novels.

### **Word Work**

Spelling tests will occur during a 5 day week. Lists will go out on Monday and Quizzes will take place on Friday.

## Math



Spelling tests will occur during a 5 day week. Lists will go out on Monday and Quizzes will take place on Friday.

We are exploring patterns with 5 main goals.

1. To identify and describe patterns found in tables and charts including in a multiplication chart.
2. Reproduce a pattern shown in a table or chart using concrete materials.
3. Represent and describe patterns and relationships using charts and tables to solve problems.
4. Express a given problem as an equation in which a symbol is used to represent an unknown number
5. Solve one Step equations involving a symbol to represent an unknown number.

## Physical Education



We have been enjoying the beautiful weather outside and have learned and played the game of Kickball as well as various other cooperative games

## Science

We have been studying Waste and Our World. Some of the topics and activities we cover include the following:



1. Identify plant and animal wastes, and describe how they are recycled in nature
2. Look at Methods of Waste Disposal:
3. Identify if waste is biodegradable or Not: Sorting Waste
4. Compare different kinds of packaging
5. Create New Waste Management Labels
6. Develop a flow chart for a consumer products
7. Identify actions that individuals and groups can take to minimize the production of wastes, to recycle or reuse wastes and to ensure the safe handling and disposal of wastes




## Grade Five News

In reading the class has continued with our shared reading of Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone. As we read, students focus on checking their comprehension through discussions, reading response journal entries, and focusing on different parts of a story such as characters, plot, and setting. At the end of the month we will watch the movie and complete several comparing and contrasting activities. To wrap-up our work with this story, students will complete a character analysis project by choosing a character from the book to examine more closely.



In writing the kids have been working hard through our Grade Five Writing Bootcamp to brush up their understanding of grammar, parts of speech, and solid sentence structure. The class has focused on identifying mistakes in sample sentences and passages, correcting those mistakes, then transferring what they have learned to their own writing. I've loved reading what the class has written so far - it gives such insight into their personalities!

So far in math the class has worked to learn our routines and have been reviewing number concepts. These review lessons include place value, representing numbers in a variety of ways such as expanded form, written form, and with base ten blocks, and understanding the value of digits depending on their positions. The class also had an opportunity to practice their rounding skills, then worked in small groups to complete a virtual math Escape Room - it was a blast seeing the kids persevere and cooperate to meet their goal.




## Grade 6 News

Welcome to another year at Dorothy Dalglish. My name is Adam Gibson and I am presently teaching in the Grade 6 class while Ms. Milne-Yanke is away on leave. I've enjoyed meeting all the grade six students and look forward to getting to know them better over the next few weeks.



The class is off to an excellent start to the year. Here is what we have been up to: Language Arts - We have been reading "Knife", a short story by Sarah Ellis and we have been focusing on writing short stories, concentrating on detail and description in our writing.

Social - We are doing our first unit on democracy and we were able to discuss the federal election in "real time."



Math - We started our unit on Number Sense and have been working with numbers up to and including a million. We have focused on addition and subtraction of these numbers and will be starting on multiplication and division shortly.

Science - Our first unit is on Trees and Forests and we have been discussing food webs.



Just a few other things:

Please have your child read at least 15-20 minutes a night. In order to become better readers, they must be practicing regularly. It doesn't really matter what they read, as long as it is appropriate for their ability.
