



I can't wait to see what November brings.


THEMES: Our themes for November are Fairy Tales and Nursery Rhymes

October flew by as quickly as September did! I hope you all had a great month! We are looking forward to a great Halloween day in our room to end off this month. We have been working hard on reviewing and learning our letters and their corresponding sounds. This is really helping us to learn to decode words that we don't know. We are counting daily by 1s, 5s and 10s as we figure out how many days of school we have had so far. We are just about to complete our unit on Patterns, and we ROCK at naming all different kinds of patterns. In Science, we are completing our Changing Seasons unit. We have also been observing our daily weather, and we have figured out that we like Summer much better than Fall in terms of how warm or cool it can be!



Social Studies has seen us learning all about man-made structures and natural landforms, bodies of water, and we will be on to learning about where we live in the world. We are still working hard at following directions and daily routines, and it is coming. I am looking forward to talking with you all during Parent/Teacher Conferences.



Grade 2 News



In Language Arts we will continue working on the reading strategy of self-monitoring, which means asking ourselves questions while we read to make sure we understand the text. Students are learning how to pick “good fit” books, to fit their purpose, interests and comprehension levels. Also, students have been doing personal writing, sharing their stories both orally and in print. We are looking forward to publishing our favorite story in the next few weeks, which will allow us to work on some revising and editing skills as well. Students are just beginning to include a problem in their stories and seem to really enjoy putting their ideas into print! I look forward to reading all of the grade 2 creations throughout this year.



In math we are working on our patterns and algebra unit and students are demonstrating their knowledge of the outcomes that we have covered so far. Our next unit will be numbers to 50 and we will discuss the importance of place value. We are also working on problem solving by using our reading skills to read questions, identify what the question is asking us to find, re-reading the question to identify information we need and then solve the problem. We will continue to practice these steps throughout each of the upcoming units as well.

In science we have just finished our unit on Magnets and the class really seemed to enjoy this hands-on unit. In Social Studies we are just starting to learn about the 3 Canadian cities, Meteghan, Iqaluit and Saskatoon that the class will learn about this year.



Finally, we will have a PSI student teacher joining our classroom on November 15th. His name is Mr. Anderson and the class met him on October 24th. We all look forward to getting to know him better and can't wait to welcome him to our DDS community.

HAPPY NOVEMBER!

We are going to start reading Stone Fox as a class, to explore and practice comprehension strategies that good readers use, and we are also adding more word-decoding strategies to our "toolboxes." Throughout this year, students will be reading a variety of books, and will hopefully enjoy the many genres they encounter. So far we have read numerous picture books, Socks and Flat Stanley. In the very near future students will be bringing home their own flat characters so watch for a note explaining how this project works!



The grade 3 class is continuing their work on writing personal narratives. Everyone has chosen their favorite story to focus on, adding details, trying different story leads and revising to make it their very best. I can't wait to have students share their finished pieces!

In math we are finishing a unit on patterns. Our social studies unit is learning about goods and services, celebrations and traditions, leaders, quality of life, geography, and rights and responsibilities that we have in our own community and then comparing these areas to Peru. In science we are finishing up rocks and minerals, with our next unit being hearing and sound.

THANK YOU to families who encourage their children to read, study spelling words, or practice math skills each night, as this habit will definitely benefit them in the future! I really appreciate all of your support!



Grade 4 News

In **Language Arts**, we are moving towards forming Guided Reading groups to practice reading strategies and comprehension. We are working on our writing skills by focusing on sentence structure, such as capitalization, punctuation and grammar, as well as how we write a strong paragraph. We are using all of these strategies to wrap up our Personal Narrative Writing unit and move into Imaginative Story writing later in November. We will be continuing to use spelling words and quizzes as well.

I am excited to announce that we will be starting a new novel study together! I am thrilled to read and enjoy the adventure of ***Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief*** with the whole class. We will be participating in group discussion, character analysis and comprehension questions that align with the novel. Can't wait to start reading!



In **Math**, we are continuing with our Number Sense as we focus on understanding place value with the help of Base Ten blocks, expanded form, and we will be moving into some measurement and how to read the time!

In **Social Studies**, we are beginning to look at and learn all about Alberta! We will be learning about the different regions, the resources, the landforms and so much more! I am excited to be celebrating all the incredible things about our province!



In **Physical Education** we will be starting Basketball! As a class, we are going to learn basic drills and skills associated with basketball and enjoy playing friendly games on the court.

Grade 5 News

For the month of November, students will continue to work on their self-monitoring comprehension skills in reading. Students will have the opportunity to read a biography article about Thomas Prince who was an Indigenous war hero. Prince was part of the Devil's Brigade, an elite paratrooping unit, during World War II. Students will also be strengthening their skills through small guided reading groups. By mid-November we will move into our next reading comprehension strategy unit focusing on analyzing texts to identify main ideas and supporting details.



In writing we have just begun our realistic fiction story writing unit. To kick off the unit students will focus on brainstorming sessions. Students will learn different ways to generate ideas including thinking of an important person or place, examining the world around us for an ordinary moment, or even dreaming about stories that we wish existed in the world. Throughout the unit, the class will learn about character development, plotting an arc for our stories, writing in ways that help readers visualize the events, focusing on the most important details, writing interesting leads, creating settings that the reader can imagine, and writing powerful endings.



In math the class has been focusing on strengthening our mental math skills through decomposing and composing numbers. This is an important concept that helps students to build a stronger understanding of the value of the numbers they are working with, and aids students to complete operations such as addition and multiplication. It is expected that students in grade five understand, recall, and apply multiplication and division facts up to 9×9 . Students will practice several different mental math strategies such as annexing then adding zero, halving and doubling, and working with multiples in order to help us reach that goal. The class will also learn more about the properties of multiplication. Students have also done a lot of work with visual multiplication, creating arrays and equal group pictures to match different equations and problems. Part way through November students will begin their study of fractions.

Notes:

- We are fortunate to have a student teacher from the University of Lethbridge coming to our grade five class. Kim Scott will be joining us from Nov. 15 - Dec. 16.

Hello! My name is Ms. Owens and I have been with the grade 6 students for two weeks now. I cannot believe that it is already November! I've enjoyed meeting all the grade six students and look forward to getting to know them better until the return of Ms. Milne-Yanke.




Since I have joined the team, we have started fresh with the next units in Grade 6. Here is what we have been up to:

Language Arts - We have been doing a class read-aloud of "The Wild Robot", a novel written by Peter Brown. It is a brilliant 'robot nature adventure' story of Wall-E meets Hatchet. Our literacy class is centered around the novel while we work on comprehension through new vocabulary, constructed response questions surrounding all literary elements, and skill practice through an animal research project to bring the book to life.

Social - We continued the conversation on Democracy while learning about citizenship and the importance of our rights and responsibilities. We focus on Canada's fundamental elements by reading, debating, and putting our knowledge to the test with questions, fill in the blanks, true & false, and making text to world connections. The grade 6's have been very attentive during our Social Studies conversations and I could not be happier!

Math - After working on mixed numbers and improper fractions and having almost finished working on ratios and percentages, we will be starting a new unit next week that is all about Patterns and Equations. Within these lessons we continue to practice fundamental math skills to help get them ready for grade 7.



Science - We have moved on to the Sky Science Unit and the students are currently researching each planet in our Solar System before creating their mini books about planets. The Mini Book Project will be introduced next week and wrapped up just before the Remembrance Day break.

Just a few other things:

- 1) Please have your child read at least 15-20 minutes a night. In order to become better readers, they must be practicing regularly. It doesn't really matter what they read, as long as it is appropriate for their ability.




We were able to purchase some fantastic books for the library!!
