Please take a few moments to complete this survey - your participation supports local and provincial planning and is very important to us.

Here are some important notes for parents regarding the survey:

- 1. The survey package will include:
 - * a Random Access Code for accessing the survey online and instructions for accessing the survey in other languages, if needed.

2. Parents with more than one student in the relevant survey grades will receive a separate survey package and Random Access Code for each child.

3. The survey will remain open until March 25, 2022.




Grade 1 News

Grade 2 News

Where has the time gone? It is already March! The Grade 2's are continuing to work hard on improving their reading and writing during February. We have been working through a program called "Lively Letters" that helps students remember and identify sounds and spelling patterns within words. The students are really enjoying this "interactive" program and they are using their new skills to help with their spelling, reading and writing. Please ask your child about this program and if they or you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact me. In



March we will also be focusing on the reading strategy of sequencing, through our individual reading as well as in our guided reading groups.



In our writing we are concentrating on creating original stories that have interesting beginnings, which draw our readers in, developing setting by using our senses and introducing our main character by adding a few of his/her physical characteristics as well as personality traits. Students are just beginning to work on editing stories they have written previously and we will be making a few classroom books for all to enjoy.

In Math we are wrapping up our unit on addition and subtraction (numbers to 50) and will be increasing our math skills by now including numbers from 0 to 100. We have also been working on calendar skills daily, such as ordinals, odd/even numbers and skip counting by 2's, 5's and 10's. At home you can continue to help your child with all of these skills by playing card games, snakes and ladders and dominoes.

In Social we are also wrapping up our section on natural resources and jobs that can be found in our three Canadian cities: Iqaluit, Meteghan and Saskatoon.

In Science we will be soon starting our unit on temperature. You could help your child with this unit by discussing the temperature in Celsius on a daily basis, how to dress appropriately for the weather and if possible allow your child try and read a thermometer you may have outside.



I also attended some fabulous sessions during the Teachers Convention and have already started to share some of these activities with the students.

Finally, I look forward to discussing your child's progress in March.



Grade 3 News

I know I'm getting older but I truly can't believe how fast this year is flying by! We're heading into March already and I'm definitely looking forward to some consistent spring weather... hopefully!





In writing the children are busy finishing up their information books, putting the finishing touches on typing, editing, adding pictures and making sure they are ready to publish. We will share the finished products with a class Gallery Walk to celebrate all of the hard work students have put into their books. Our next unit is persuasive writing.

In math we are continuing in our unit on adding and subtracting 3-digit numbers with and without regrouping. I love to see the excitement that this group of students shows towards math and they always make me so proud with the effort that they put into their daily work. Our next unit is MULTIPLICATION! During class time, students will be working on learning their multiplication facts to 5X5 by drawing pictures to represent various multiplication equations and also using arrays to visualize the concepts. Any extra practice you can do at home to learn the multiplication facts will definitely be beneficial to your child.

We are finishing up our science unit on Hearing and Sound so our next units will be Building and Testing. Students will first learn about various building materials and what makes a structure stronger, and then they will be able to construct a structure to test their knowledge!



Grade 4 News

In Language Arts **Reading** we have begun reading, the class participated in a min-version of a 'book tasting' where we had an assortment of different novels to discuss and we read the first page of each. After that, the class voted on their next read aloud, so we have begun reading **Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone** by J.K Rowling. We continue to make predictions and analyze characters as we read on.

In **Writing**, we have switched gears into writing fiction stories! We are discussing what makes writing fiction and whether it can be realistic or unrealistic fiction. We will be looking at the different elements of story writing and make our way into writing our own fiction stories.



In Math we are continuing with multiplication. Students are working

their way to practicing and knowing up to their 9x9 facts. We are focusing on using arrays, making equal groups, and how to use distributive property. There are many ways to practice and learn math facts!

We finished our simple machines unit in **Science.** The class made very cool amusement park rides, and it was such a blast to see each of them use their creativity and imagination for their machines. Since this unit is complete, we are shifting our focus to our next **Social Studies** unit on Alberta: The Stories, Histories and People. We will be learning about things such as Indigenous groups of Alberta, the Fur Trade, Settlers and more!

I am looking forward to another month full of learning and laughter with the grade 4 class!


Grade Five News

In reading we will start March by wrapping-up our Making Connections comprehension focus. Students have learned about different types of connections including text-to-self, text-to-text, and text-to-world. To practice this comprehension strategy the class has read several traditional stories from different cultures including an Indigenous story called "Rainbow Crow" and a Greek myth about Prometheus. The class has also practiced making connections by reading passages about different careers, as well as different non-profit organizations



started by children to help make the world a better place. Towards the middle of March we will move on to our next strategy, Predicting. Students will focus on strengthening their comprehension by predicting future events based on evidence from the text. If we have time we'll also be experimenting with "Choose Your Own Adventure" books and might even have a chance to create our own texts inspired by this style of story.

Our next writing unit will focus on writing about literature. We will continue to work with the structure of an essay, but this time we will build our thesis statements around themes we find in stories we have read. We will start with the model text "Fox", and will work as a class to identify themes, examples of figurative language, and the motivations of the characters in the story. From there students will create their own literary essays. If time allows, students will then write a second essay based on a story of their own choosing.



WOW! That's all I can say about the determination and perseverance the class has demonstrated as we finish up our Patterns and Relations unit, focusing on introductory algebra concepts. The class has really stretched themselves with their understanding of mathematical expressions, replacing variables to solve expressions, and solving equations with variables. Our next unit focuses on multiplication and division operations. In

grade five students are expected to multiply 2-digit by 2-digit numbers (45×23), and divide 3-digit numbers by a single divisor ($436 \div 7$). These are very demanding skills but the class is ready for the challenge!

Grade 6 News

This is Mrs. Yanke and Ms. Owens sending you an update and warm spring wishes!! We are leading up to our Year End Field Trip! Our Grade 6 gang will be headed to the Calgary Hangar Flight Museum to enhance our Aerodynamics and Flight science unit. Then we'll head to Monster Mini Golf for some well-deserved mini-golf, games and snacks.



We have had a strong focus on positive classroom relationships, and a classroom project called the "Respect Effect." Another focus is student organization and leadership. Grade 6 students have taken on additional classroom responsibilities and school-wide morning announcements - go Grade 6!!

In Language Arts, students are studying Media and Advertising. As a group, students have had to analyze and present their findings on television commercials, advertising techniques, target audiences and overall effectiveness. We are now working on analyzing print ads, and students will be working on creating print advertisements. This crew has demonstrated a discerning and skeptical eye in getting to the heart of the media messages that surround them:)

We're also engaged in Word of the Day and word sorts to help students build vocabulary and spelling skills. We are reading the novel "Touching Spirit Bear," a gritty story about a juvenile offender who is banished to an Alaskan as punishment for his misdeeds. It's quite a read!

In Social Studies, we have moved onto the second half of our course outcomes focusing on historical models of democracy. Students will analyze the structure and functions of the democratic system in

ancient Athens as well as the Iroquois Confederacy. Students are working on creating websites to display what they have learned about the structure and functions of the Iroquois Confederacy. We can't wait to share these with parents when they are complete!

engaging way to look at Math through the lens of data collection, graphing, interpreting graphs,

experiments, questionnaires, surveys, databases, chance, uncertainty, experimental and theoretical probability.

In Science, we are exploring the characteristics of air and the interaction between moving air and solids. We have been doing many hands-on activities and labs to explore all the properties of air. After the break, by studying birds and planes, we will learn a variety of adaptations and designs that make flight possible and that provide for propulsion and control. On March 3rd, we will be heading to visit the Hangar Flight Museum in Calgary to help enhance learning about the parts of an aircraft,



their role in controlled flight, and the differences between aircraft and spacecraft. We are so excited!

Just a few other things:

Please have your child read at least 15-20 minutes a night. In order to become better readers, they must be practicing regularly. It doesn't really matter what they read, as long as it is appropriate for their ability. We have been working on completing tasks throughout our reading challenge booklet! **If you haven't already joined the DDS Grade 6 class on the Remind app, please join using the following link: **remind.com/join/ddsgr6





Fresh Air Policy

It is expected that all students will go outside for recess and during the noon hour. We feel that this opportunity to breathe fresh air is extremely important for a healthy learning environment. If your child is not well enough to go outside, he/she is probably not well enough to be at school.

If it is absolutely necessary for your child to remain indoors at recess, please phone or send a note to the teacher.

This "fresh air" policy necessitates that parents exercise care to ensure that their children are adequately dressed to reflect the prevailing weather conditions. During the winter we ask that your children come to school prepared with warm coat, snow pants, boots, mittens and a warm hat. The students need to be able to dress for any of the extreme weather changes that can occur in this country.
