Thank you to Mrs. Stauth for all her help with track meet and for the countless things she does for our school to make it run smoothly.


Thank you to Mrs. McGregor for everything she does for the staff, students and parents at DDS.








I can't believe we're heading into June already! I'm not sure where this school year went but I have had the opportunity to work with an amazing group of grade 3 students!

In Language Arts we are finishing the novel <u>Because of Winn Dixie</u>, focusing on the characters as well as the "story mountain" that we typically see in books. Next we will be exploring poetry with students reading poems as well as writing different types of poems. They will be working at incorporating figurative language into their written pieces as well. To celebrate the end of our poetry unit each student will share his / her favourite poem. In true "slam poetry" fashion we will show our appreciation by snapping our fingers (instead of clapping) for our fellow poets!



Our last math unit is fractions. Students will learn that a fraction represents a part of a whole, describe situations where fractions are used and compare fractions of the same whole that have the same denominator.

Our final unit in science is animal life cycles and students are learning about animal classification, habitats and specific life cycles of various animals. In social studies we will learn about India as well as how we can be responsible global citizens in our world.

On June 9, the grade 3 and 4 classes will be going on our field trip to the Head Smashed-In Buffalo Jump and a park in Fort Macleod. Please refer to the list that will be sent home as a reminder of what your child needs to bring along on this day. The grades 2 and 3 classes will also be touring the Prairie Tractor Club on June 15. Grade 4 News

In Language Arts Reading we have been enjoying the incredible Strangeworlds
Travel Agency by L.D. Lapinski. The class has had the opportunity to discuss the
plot and characters, as well as let their creativity flow by creating a world they would
like to visit and designing the suitcase that would take them there!



In **Writing**, we have been working on **personal essays** with the help of Ms. Hemstreet. The class has • worked through many different ways to gather ideas, how to express and represent ideas through developing detail and context, and organizing these ideas in a way that has the most impact. Each • student has been writing on a topic of their choice, and it has been wonderful seeing their hard work paying off.

In **Math** we have been learning about **measurement** and finding the area and perimeter of shapes. The class was able to learn the A=bxh formula, and apply it in workbooks and games. We have also been learning about geometric shapes and applying what we know and making patterns. For the remainder of the school year, we will focus on pre-algebra for a week, so finding the missing number in an equation (ex: 9 + __ = 27), and we will end with **Statistics and Probability** by surveying the class and making a variety of graphs to represent our findings.

In **Science**, the class has been learning all about **Plant Growth and Changes**! We have learned about different types of plants and their needs, plant classification, how plants reproduce, and the class has grown their own bean seeds and flower seeds! Hopefully they are still growing! They were so excited every morning to see if their plants had grown, and it was awesome to see their engagement with the unit. To wrap up, we will be doing one final **Social Studies** unit on celebrating Alberta. We will discuss tourism in Alberta, diversity and more. This will tie in nicely with our field trip on June 9th to Head Smashed in Buffalo Jump!

It has been such a pleasure to teach this incredible group of learners!

Grade Five News

In June we are completing our final writing unit of the year, poetry! Throughout the month of June students will be creating their own poetry anthologies, or collections. We will learn about different techniques for improving word choice, such as

alliteration, figures of speech such as similes and metaphors,



and many other strategies for creating imagery and strengthening voice. Students will also be able to choose a theme for their poems and we will integrate artwork when publishing our poems.

In reading, students will be finishing up their study of the synthesizing comprehension strategy which requires readers to put together all the pieces to make meaning. Often this involves determining the importance of different details or information, in order to get the gist of a text. Students read several nonfiction articles to practice this skill. Synthesizing also relies on making connections to prior knowledge about topics.

In math the class is finishing up May with our study of Transformations. Students are expected to identify and perform single-step transformations to 2D shapes including rotations, reflections, and translations. Our final unit of the year will be Statistics and Probability. This unit involves a lot of games of chance so that students are able to describe single outcomes (when you roll a die there is only one outcome that occurs), and compare the likelihood of two outcomes.

Important Notes:

• Our year-end field trip is scheduled for Thursday, June 16th, 2022 and we will be spending the day at SABC. Students will arrive at school as usual in the morning, but will need to be picked up from the school later that evening as well will not return in time for students to ride the school bus. There will be a cost of approximately \$25 per student. *Please return permission forms as soon as possible:*)



Grade 6 News

Earlier this month, Grade 6 students hosted our second DDS assembly this year, complete with our mascot Flip, cheesy jokes, and school-wide reminders.

Congratulations to Grade 6 students for completing their first PAT. The English Language Arts PAT: Writing Part A can be particularly challenging. All students were able to complete the assessment, and several students commented that it was an invigorating experience:)

Also, a big thank you goes out to Picture Butte High School for inviting our students to their Open House evening. After a complimentary BBQ, parents and students received a guided tour of the school, and then gathered for a visual presentation with Principal Mark Lowe.

In <u>Language Arts</u>, we are studying poetry and figurative language such as metaphors, similes, onomatopoeias, hyperboles, alliteration to name a few. Students are investigating classic pieces such as "The Cremation of Sam Mcgee," and using their knowledge of figurative language to make meaning of poems.





In <u>Mathematics</u>, we began our 3-D shapes unit with an introduction to nets and surface area. We will also be looking at volume formulas and liquid capacity and fluid measurement this month. We are also revisiting division this month to help review for the computational Math component of the Math PAT.

In our **<u>Science</u>** unit, Evidence and Investigation, we have casted footprints, and printed shoe impressions. We are now looking at animal tracks and fingerprints this week. We are hoping to culminate this unit by using evidence to solve a criminal mystery.





Democracy in Ancient Athens is our current <u>Social Studies</u> focus. Students have begun the "Day in the Life of Ancient Athens" project whereby they are randomly assigned a social status in Ancient Athens (citizen, metic or slave), and they will describe their Athenian life through journal entries, pictures and captions. This project will help students review the social structure of Athenian society, their political assembly, courts and council.

A few Reminders...

Grade 6 students can use a calculator for part of their Math PAT. Please ensure that your child has a calculator available. These can be inexpensive, simple calculators. Graphing calculators are not permitted.

Please send your child to school with a healthy snack / lunch whenever possible. I am noticing that students are coming to school with an increasing amount of candy and pop which is not conducive to calm, focused learning.

Encourage your child to read at home for 30 minutes everyday, especially this month as we head into PATs. Provincial Achievement Tests require students to read for long stretches, so we have been trying to help students build up their reading stamina all year.

FCSS and Family Ties have partnered to bring a summer camp to Picture Butte this July for children aged 8—11 years old. See the information below for a list of potential activities campers may participate in:

"The specific agenda for this upcoming camp has not been completely decided yet, so here is an overview of what our past camps have looked like. Our camps are full of hands on activities and games, as well as art projects and other skill-building activities. We like to get kids outside in the fresh air (weather permitting) and engage in outdoor games like obstacle races, tag, and playing on outdoor playground equipment. We encourage youth to be good citizens and take garbage bags with us to the park to do a little park clean-up. We also teach being safe and not picking up items that are sharp (i.e. broken glass) and to also alert an adult if such items are found.

Indoor activities often include experiments, sometimes they make recipes for fun snacks to eat, learn about and engage in games from other countries, do art projects that explore various kinds of art supplies and encourage self expression and we usually have a day for engaging in Blackfoot activities directed by indigenous staff. Depending on the group, sometimes we include a "show and tell" day where the youth can bring something to show and tell about. This has been a highlight for camps as youth present on things that they love. Our activities focus on teaching youth how to do things that they can reproduce at home. So our craft activities, for example, will be easy to find supplies such as cardboard you can find leftover from packaging and paint you could get at a dollar store. We assign workers to camps so that there is one worker for every five youths.

We ask that all campers come with a lunch and a water bottle clearly labeled with their name. We also remind parents that we may go on nature walks or do activities outside, so please send kiddos with appropriate shoes, sunscreen, and possibly a jacket/windbreaker"
