




Grade 1 News



Grade 2 News



We had a very busy October! We had a wonderful time on our field trip to the Helen Schuler Nature Center and Galt Museum - we had fun making butter and learning about the food chain. We came dressed in our best smiles for picture day and in art we worked hard on making our own monsters in preparation for Halloween. We enjoyed a class Halloween party (thank you to all of the parents who brought snacks!) and a school-wide Halloween parade. Also, it was a ton of fun picking out new books at the Book Fair - THANK YOU Mrs. Pittman for all of your hard work. Speaking of books...we also went to the Picture Butte Public Library as a class. Students really enjoyed learning about all the library services and programs offered. Library cards are free again this year and a great way for kids to get access to new books! As a class, we started a home

reading program where students are entered into draws for various prizes.

In math, we finished up our place value unit on hundreds, tens, and ones. We even did a class project where we ran a candy store and did lots of activities related to place value, like tracking inventory, ordering supplies, making sales, and advertising. We are now working on even or odd, comparing numbers using greater than or less than, and ordering numbers.

In writing, we have been focused on personal narratives - writing true stories about our life. We learned three different ways to 'hook' our reader. We also learned how to transition into a beginning, middle, and end, and thought up some fun ways to conclude our story! Coming up we look forward

to letter writing - as we prepare for a final project of writing letters to Santa. In reading and bell work we have started reading centers, which include printing, bell work, flashlight reading, online reading, partner reading, word games, reading with an adult, and more!

In science, we are continuing to learn about Hot and Cold. We did experiments this month that included finding a way to melt chocolate, creating heat, and a craft where we made our own thermometers. We enjoyed ice cream sundaes as we learned about why some things are cold - and why we get brain freeze! In November, we will start our first social unit - A Community in the Past! We are excited to learn how and why communities change over time.

In the gym, we are learning volleyball skills! We tried keeping a balloon in the air and learned some ways to hit it to our partners. We even got to try some skills on the real volleyballs! Next, we are excited for more team and tag games, and floor hockey! We are also

learning about Empathy in health.

Grade 3 News

We are going to start reading Stone Fox as a class to explore and practice comprehension strategies that good readers use, and we are also working daily on learning the 6 syllable types which will help us to decode tricky words when reading independently. Throughout this year students will be reading a variety of books and will hopefully enjoy the many genres they encounter. So far we have read numerous picture books, Socks and Flat Stanley. In the very near future



students will be bringing home their own flat characters so watch for a note explaining how this project works!

The grade 3 class is continuing their work on writing personal narratives. Everyone has chosen their favorite story to focus on, adding details, trying different story leads and revising to make it their very best. I can't wait to have students share their finished pieces!

In math we are finishing a unit on place value with our next unit being addition and subtraction. Our social studies unit is learning about goods and services, celebrations and traditions, leaders, quality of life, geography, and rights and responsibilities that we have in our own community and then comparing these areas to Peru. In science we are finishing up rocks and minerals and we will move on to our hearing and sound unit next.

Congratulations to Tavish and Decker for getting 100% on five spelling tests in a row! They have "bumped up" to a more challenging group and I am so proud of how hard they have worked!

THANK YOU to families who encourage their children to read, study spelling words, or practice math skills each night as this habit will definitely benefit them in the future! I really appreciate all of your support!

Wow, how October has flown by!

Here's a quick glance at what we have been learning:

• We have gotten into a solid routine for our Independent Literacy choices where students get to choose reading and writing activities, while I read with a small group.



- Students have gotten started on writing some realistic fiction stories. They are coming up with some great stories and I am looking forward to our writing celebration at the end of the month.
- In Math, we have been working on adding and subtracting numbers to 1000, as well as reading the time on an analog and digital clock.
- We have begun learning about Alberta and its vastness in Social Studies. Ask your student what they know about the regions in Alberta!
- We have got quite the team of developing volleyball players in our class! Those other schools better watch out in 2-3 years when we hit the courts!

Grade Five

For November we will be shifting our focus from whole group reading and comprehension activities, to small guided reading groups that target students' specific learning needs. Students will continue to learn about the elements of a story (problem, solution, characters, setting) and how monitoring our understanding of these elements helps us to build stronger comprehension



overall. Students will also learn about types of conflict, how to use context clues to decode unfamiliar words, and text features. In November we will apply our learning to a new genre (biography) with the story "Courage and Honour" which tells about the life of an Indigenous Canadian veteran of World War II.



In writing the class has extended their understanding of sentence structure to paragraph writing using a hamburger analogy. Students practiced writing and identifying topic sentences, relevant and irrelevant details, transition words/phrases, and closing sentences. Students honed their paragraph writing skills through their reading responses, fall themed prompts, writing stations, as well as student-directed writing time.

In math we are swimming right along, continuing to focus on building mathematical mindsets and communicating our thinking. Students have begun their study of fractions and decimals with a focus on naming and representing numbers less than one in a variety of ways. In November we will continue this focus on fractions and decimals using models to visualize the values in order to compare and order numbers in both forms. The class will continue to engage in Number Talks and open-ended math challenges as part of our weekly routine.



Grade 6 News

The year is just zooming by! Our Grade 4-6 students enjoyed their nature trip to Beauvais Lake as part of the CPAWS (Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society) program to help students understand our role in supporting and protecting natural habitats. A big shout goes out to Mrs. Pittman for throwing another fantastic Book Fair! Grade 6 students continue to enjoy writing and broadcasting our morning announcements. Students are also enjoying MCing assemblies and helping out with leadership tasks. We are planning a November Dance for Grade 4-6 which should be an exciting event for our older students!

In <u>Language Arts</u>, students are engaged in our "Writing About Literature" writing unit. We are studying short stories with the intention of applying our 'Elements of Story' concepts to several literary pieces. Students enjoyed the absurd "Wife of Bath's Tale" by Geoffrey Chaucer, and will begin the serendipitous story "Knife" by Sarah Ellis. Students are using a storytelling arc graphic organizer to identify, and write about specific parts of story plot. Identifying types of characters and character traits is also a focus of this writing unit. Students continue to improve spelling and word skill through weekly word sorts and our Word of the Day daily vocabulary routine.



In <u>Mathematics</u>, we are seeing continued growth in mental math during our Number Talk segments. In our current Number Sense unit, students are gaining an understanding of integers and applying them in equations. We are also revisiting multi digit addition and subtraction, exponents, and continued practice with order of operations.

In <u>Science</u>, we are drawing to the end of our Trees and Forests unit as students are investigating concepts such as food chain webs, transpiration, types of leaves and trees, and threats to forest biomes.

In <u>Social Studies</u>, students have been eager to discuss the Canadian judicial system, the rule of law, levels of government, direct and representative government, duties and responsibilities of citizens, and the Charter of Rights and Freedoms.

Music Class News

October has flown by and we have had so much fun singing about fall themes...especially leaves and pumpkins!

In Kindergarten, we have continued to focus on finding our singing voice and have really enjoyed exploring high and low by growing into tall trees that drop leaves on our heads in fall. We have also been adding special sound effects to stories during our music time. In the gym, Kindergarten students have been moving in many different ways (locomotor skills), have enjoyed balancing bean bags on different body parts and have learned about fire safety.

The Grade 1 class continues to show their creativity for making up new words to songs and showing high and low while singing or doing actions with a parachute. We have also continued to talk about and listen to music from the different instrument families such as woodwinds, percussion, brass, and strings.

In Grade 2, this group of enthusiastic singers has enjoyed a variety of singing games with actions and using scarves to demonstrate falling leaves. We also had a lot of fun adding sound effects to the story "Run, Turkey Run".

In Grade 3, we have been singing, clapping rhythm patterns, and trying different bean bag singing games. We have also been echo singing using solfege hand signs.

The Grade 4 class has had a lot of fun learning a partner/line song as our warm-up activity. They are also getting very proficient at beating me at Poison Rhythm We continue to explore music from different parts of the world.

The Grade 5 & 6 students are differentiating beat and rhythm and have enjoyed learning some body percussion patterns. We have also been doing rhythm play-alongs with orchestral music as well as playing music themed games.

I hope you have all had an opportunity to hear your child sing or share something they have learned in music class. As a special note, I have started a lunchtime choir every Thursday from 12:00 - 12:20 for Grade 1 - 6 students and we will be performing a special song for the Remembrance Day Assembly on Nov. 10th!
