Starting February 6th, parents with students in grades 4 - 12 will start receiving survey packages by mail from Alberta Education for the 2023 Assurance Survey. Please take a few moments to complete this survey - your participation supports local and provincial planning and is very important to us.

Here are some important notes for parents regarding the survey:

- 1. The survey package will include:
 - * a copy of the Education Minister's letter
 - * a Random Access Code for accessing the survey online and instructions for accessing the survey in other languages, if needed.
- Once you receive your Random Access Code you can start the survey using this link: https://public.education.alberta.ca/APOS/
- 2. Parents with more than one student in the relevant survey grades will receive a separate survey package and Random Access Code for each child.
- 3. The survey will remain open until **March 3rd, 2023**. Students in grades 4 6 will complete their surveys during class time .



Grade 2 News

January was a great, fun-filled month for all of us! We were glad to go on our community walk and deliver crafts with our DDS families. In February, we are looking forward to Valentine's Day and 100's day - more information will be coming home soon.

In math, we have started our addition unit, and we are getting so good at mental math strategies. We have also learned how to make ten and doubles and near doubles. It is important that



students continue to practice their counting and addition skills.

Science has been tons of fun. We did a demonstration on apples - did you know that they are magnetic? Ask your child why! We also did an experiment where we blended cereal down and then pulled out the iron pieces using magnets. We have been learning about how magnets have two poles and the different types of magnets and magnetic elements.

In reading, we are continuing with Daily Five. Every child gets at least 20 minutes of small group reading time on most weekdays, and I have seen tremendous progress in our classes' reading skills. It has been awesome to see confidence and fluency growing! Continue to keep reading at home and filling out your home reading log in order to be entered into our weekly draw! Way to go! We have also been reading According to Humphrey as a class - the kids love this funny and endearing novel about a hamster who lives at school as a class pet. We have used this book as an example in plot diagrams, using a beginning, middle, and end. This month we have also been focusing on rising and falling action and how we know when we have reached a problem.

In writing, we have been focusing on How-To books. We learned the steps to writing a how-to book, including creating a topic sentence, developing a sequence of steps using transition words like next, finally, first, and then a conclusion. Students wrote how-to books on making a PB and J sandwich, although they weren't very specific and I took their directions a little *too literally - so funny! We built structures from lego and other building supplies, and had to create how-to books on how to build our structure. We have also been practicing making words. We read poems together as a class and then use it to build*

words with letter tiles. When we are done, we sort the words based on things they have in common. We have learned the difference between synonyms and antonyms and are using them to make our writing better.

In PE and health, we have been playing basketball. We learned how to pass, shoot, and dribble. We have also played lots of fun new tag games, like line tag and hot dog tag. We are learning about managing strong emotions like anxiety or anger, and what happens when we 'flip our lid'. We started a new unit on living healthy, including healthy eating, exercise, and sleep.

I cannot wait to see what next month brings - February will be filled with lots of love and learning. Please reach out to me with questions or concerns by email, class dojo, or phone.

Grade 3 News

January seemed to fly by! I cannot believe we're heading into February already! In Language Arts students are writing information books that will be published and shared with classmates. All students have chosen a topic that they are experts on and are writing chapters to teach information to others. At the end of our writing and editing, students will type up their books to celebrate with a "gallery share" of our work.

We are also reading The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe so soon we will be watching the movie to see what similarities and differences there are between the written and media forms. Students will compare the two, using a Venn diagram and sharing what they found with classmates at the end. We will also continue reading self-selected books to practice our reading strategies.

I have really seen students practicing their words for our weekly spelling assessments and I am so proud of the work they are doing. Great job, Grade 3s! Also, a big congratulations to Ryker and Katilyn who have had 100% on their spelling tests five times in a row so they have "bumped up" to a more challenging group. Be proud of all of your hard work!

We finished up our unit on addition and subtraction and have started our patterns unit. We are learning about increasing and decreasing patterns, writing pattern rules and differentiating between finite and infinite patterns. BE MY VALENTINE

We are continuing to work on our Hearing and Sound unit in science and are finishing up Peru in Social Studies. Our next unit will be Tunisia.

Our class will be celebrating Valentine's Day on February 14 with a little party. If your child is planning on bringing valentines to exchange, I am asking that they bring one for everyone in the class. I will send home a class list so you have all of the names of children in our room.

Grade 5 News

For the month of February the class will wrap-up our study of sequencing as a comprehension strategy. Sequencing is all about putting things in order, so as children read the focus is on the order of events in a story, or the facts and dates in non-fiction books. To help us visualize this



comprehension strategy, students will use plot diagrams (also known as story mountains) and timelines to organize and demonstrate their understanding of what they have read. In connection to this comprehension unit, students are also learning about the theme of a story and how to provide evidence of their thinking. Our next comprehension strategy will focus on building connections between the text we are reading, other texts, the world around us, and ourselves.

In writing the class has started work on personal essays focused on sharing about people, places, topics, and memories that are important to them. We have begun working on the structure of a thesis statement and a five paragraph essay, while also building on our ideas and sentence fluency. Moving into February we will be revising and editing some of our first draft essays using checklists to increase independence.

During the past few weeks the class has focused our study on our Patterns unit with a focus on pattern rules and understanding mathematical expressions using variables. The class has worked hard to extend patterns, use in and out function charts to perform sing-step operations, and write simple expressions to match stories. As we wrap up January and move into February students will be solving for the variable in single-step operation equations (example: 93 - n = 32; $4 \times m = 36$; r + 54 = 78). The more fluent students are with their multiplication, division, addition, and subtraction facts, the easier these problems are to solve.

It feels like we really hit the ground running in 2023! Students are enjoying our KOPs (Kids on Patrol) leadership program where our Grade 4-6, in small groups, go out for recess with K-3 students in order to lead games and model inclusive play.

The Grade 6 group is also learning to sign OCanada. A big thank you to Mrs. Thomson for




lending her signing expertise! We are hoping to master this by February. In *Language Arts, students students are writing nonfiction research*

essays and have selected some fascinating topics including: the Black Plague, the Salem Witch Trials, the Wright Brothers and the first flight, WWI, WWII, the terrorist attacks of 9/11, the history of soccer, the 2004 Indonesian Tsunami, the Spanish Flu,

the evolution of the automobile, and the lost city of Pompeii to name a few. Students are focusing on building strong thesis statements and using transitions between paragraphs.

In <u>Mathematics</u>, we are spiraling through long division, order of operations, and integers to keep our skills fresh. In our current Number Sense unit, we are exploring fractions



our skills fresh. In our current Number Sense unit, we are exploring fractions. Equivalent fractions, reducing fractions, adding fractions and understanding how to work with mixed numbers is the focus. Although this unit is challenging for students, a growth mindset is helping many students to be patient in their learning.

Our Air and Aerodynamics <u>Science</u> unit is proving to be an interesting, hands-on study. We are reaching an understanding of the properties of air, and the four forces of flight: lift, thrust, weight and drag. Our parachute building project allowed students the opportunity to experiment with air resistance and drag.

In <u>Social Studies</u>, students were quick to learn about the three levels of government and the leaders at each level. Students now understand the specific services that the Federal, Provincial and Municipal governments provide.

A few Reminders...

**Encourage your child to read at home for 30 minutes everyday, and by initiating conversations about the books they are reading.

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Where has January gone? I can hardly believe we are nearing Groundhog Day and the anticipation that winter will soon give way to warmer temperatures and an early spring! I hope that everyone was able to enjoy a relaxing break and spend meaningful time with family and friends! Thank you again for braving the frigid temperatures and coming out to support your child(ren) at the Winter Concert. Little did I think when I was planning that the theme might become a reality.

In January, Kindergarten has been focusing on keeping a steady beat to music with a partner song as well as with learning about and playing the boomwhackers for the song Snowman Joe. Our gym time incorporated lots of parachute fun while we learned how to make a bubble, what was inside the bubble, how we could go under the bubble and pretend we were camping, and how to make lots of waves. We also learned about working together as a team to stay safe while using the parachute.

The Grade 1 class is learning specific instrument names and "timbres" (sounds) through the orchestrated narrative of "Peter and the Wolf" where each character is assigned a different instrument and theme. We will culminate our learning with a listening party for this masterpiece by Sergei Prokofiev.

Grade 2 has been learning a musical accompaniment for the story "Mortimer" by Robert Munsch. We are having a lot of fun making sounds that fit with the story and look forward to performing for the Grade 1 class.

In Grade 3 & 4, we began our recorder unit and your children have been encouraged to bring home their recorders to practice and have parents initial their "Practice Bug" for each 10 minutes of practice in a day.

The Grade 5 & 6 students have explored form in music using the "Finale" from Rossini's famous William Tell Overture by playing instruments and learning cup passing patterns for the different sections. Ask your child where this piece of music has been used in television shows or advertising .
