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KINDERGARTEN

Can you believe May has already come and gone? It's been an exciting, productive, and joyful month in Kindergarten filled with hands-on learning, creativity, and meaningful connections. As we begin to wrap up our school year, I wanted to share some of the wonderful things we've been working on across subject areas.

Literacy: This month, we focused on printing our first and last names neatly on lined paper, with special attention to proper spacing and capital letters. We've also been building our sentence writing skills by listening to simple sentences like "The cat sat," and writing them out while focusing on isolating sounds, using capital letters at the beginning, and ending with correct punctuation. In reading,we identified characters, and practiced distinguishing fiction from nonfiction. Students also reinforced concepts like reading from left to right and using pictures to support understanding. To build vocabulary and decoding skills, we practiced high-frequency spelling words and dove into new phonics patterns, specializing in the sound of "Ch."

Math: Our math lessons this month centered around building strong number sense. We practiced addition and subtraction using pictures, stories, and manipulatives to develop mental math strategies. We also explored measurement concepts, learning the difference between **height** and **length**, and using unit cubes to compare and record the sizes of different objects—including safari animals! As we continue our math journey, we're beginning to explore **weight** and use comparison words like heavier and lighter.

Science: In science, we've been working through two exciting units: **The Five Senses** and **Reduce**, **Reuse**, **Recycle**. Each week, we isolated and explored one of our senses. Students especially enjoyed the **taste test activity** where they closed their eyes to sample lemon juice, a gummy bear, and popcorn—discovering the difference between sour, sweet, and salty! We also explored our sense of hearing, touch and smell. and will be wrapping up with sight. In our recycling unit, we've been talking about how we can help care for our Earth by reducing waste, reusing materials, and sorting items to be recycled.

Social Studies: This month, students shared wonderful presentations about their family cultures and traditions. It's been such a heartwarming experience to learn about the rich diversity within our classroom community. We also discussed what we would like to be when we grow up, and how it might be a community hero!

Physical Education & Wellness: In P.E, we worked a lot with our aim using different materials such as frisbees, volley balls, beach balls and more to hit targets while keeping proper form! For Wellness we had two special visits from Miss Nicole, who introduced us to new Kimochi characters—Cloud and Bug. Cloud helped us talk about feelings like happy, sad, and mad, and how quickly emotions can change. We discussed better ways to express our feelings, especially when we feel frustrated. Bug taught us about bravery and how to overcome fears, a message that really resonated with the class.

As we move into June, we're looking forward to some exciting field trips, Sports Day, Kindergarten Graduation, and of course, soaking up every last moment of this wonderful year together.

Thank you for your continued support and for sharing your incredible children with me. It's been such a privilege to watch them grow!

GRADE 2-3

June here we come! This month will be filled with field trips, year end activities, and lots of curricular review! We know it will be gone in a flash!

In Reading we have been analyzing a variety of Mentor Texts and further developing our self monitoring skills, such as questioning, rereading, visualizing, and making connections.



In Writing the students have recently begun a Poetry Unit, whereby they will be using poetic devices, such as rhyming, repetition, and imagery to enhance their writing. Students will experiment with a variety of poetic structures, such as acrostic, limerick, haiku, and rhyming couplet. The students will then be practicing memorizing and reciting poetry! They are also investigating the proper usage of conventions and punctuation and how this can support communication in their written works. There has already been excellent creativity in student work and we can't wait for more!

In Math we concluded the Statistics/Data Unit. We have recently started learning about fractions. The grade 2s and 3s will be interpreting part-whole relationships using unit fractions and identifying, comparing, and modelling said fractions. In addition, the grade 3s continue to work on developing strategies to solve problems involving division facts.

Max and Alex in grade 2/3 A have mastered their 0-10 multiplication facts and are working hard at applying that knowledge to their division facts. Ellie J, Ellie B.R., and Avery are working hard to master their 7-10 facts and to develop division strategies! We would also like to celebrate Sam in 2/3B who has mastered all of his facts to 10X10. Octavia, Jesus, Maverick, Charley and Austin are also working very hard to finish up! Great work Grade 3s!

In Science, students concluded the Computer Science Unit. They enjoyed this unit so much that they continue to choose coding programs during the last 10 minutes of Computer classes as "free time"! We have just started our Living Systems Unit, whereby the students are analyzing and describing how plants and animals interact with each other and within environments.

We have concluded our "travel" for the year. However, students are now tasked with applying their learning to appreciate Canada's roles and responsibilities in global citizenship in relation to communities in India, Tunisia, Ukraine and Peru.































It's hard to believe how quickly the year has flown by! It has been a time of tremendous growth and development, and I'm incredibly proud of the progress I've seen in each student throughout the school year.

June is shaping up to be a busy and exciting month, with Track Day, field trips, and swimming all on the calendar. Summer break will be here before we know it!

A recent highlight was our class family activity—delivering painted rocks to homes in our community. It was a wonderful way to spread some joy together. We also celebrated a fun win: our class took home the Spirit Cup with 20 out of 23 students dressing up as "Tacky Tourists"! We marked the occasion with some delicious cookies.

In Literacy, we wrapped up our Poetry Unit, and the students did an outstanding job crafting their own poems. Their poetry books will be coming home by the end of the week. We've now begun our Opinion Writing unit, where students will learn to express and support their ideas in writing.

In Numeracy, we've completed our Geometry unit and are now exploring Transformations. By the end of June, we'll also cover Measurement, Time, and Statistics.

In Science, we finished our Living Systems unit and are now diving into our Space unit. Students will explore objects in space and their connection to everyday life.

In Social Studies, students are preparing for their Alberta: Stories, Histories, and People unit test on Friday—please check Edsby for the study guide. Our final Social Studies unit will be Celebrations and Challenges.

This year has truly been filled with growth, learning, and wonderful memories. It has been such a joy getting to know each and every student, and I'm so proud of all they've accomplished!

May has flown by with sunshine and a lot of exciting learning! As we approach the end of the school year, students have been motivated and full of energy. May has also been filled with lots of school spirit, from fun theme days to preparing for our upcoming Track and Field Day. A highlight this month was our community walk, where students delivered dot-painted rocks to homes around the neighborhood, a wonderful way to spread kindness!

In <u>Language Arts</u>, students began writing their informational essays. They've done a fantastic job applying their knowledge of descriptive writing and nonfiction text structures to develop clear, engaging multi-paragraph pieces. I've been so impressed by their enthusiasm and topic choices! We've also started a novel study of Hatchet, which has sparked thoughtful discussions. Next we will study the elements of stories, folk tales and oral traditions.

In *Math*, we've been exploring patterns and arithmetic sequences and reviewing the order of operations. Next, we'll solve algebraic expressions using the order of operations and algebraic equations using opposite operations. Reviewing place value and adding and subtracting with decimals has also become part of our daily morning work.

In <u>Science</u>, we kicked off our unit on climate and weather. Students have been learning about climate zones, weather tools, and how climate impacts human and animal activity. We've also collected weather data, which students have analyzed by organizing it into frequency tables, finding the mode, and creating bar graphs and dot plots.

In <u>Social Studies</u>, students are working in groups to research a region of Canada. We are researching things like climate, geography and landforms, natural resources, bodies of water, indigenous groups, and quality of life. They're enjoying unlocking new sections of their research booklet through mini-lessons in class. I'm looking forward to seeing their hard work displayed in a final project.

In Grade 6, it's been a fun filled month practicing for track & field, taking a community walk, attending the orientation at PBHS, and writing our first Provincial Achievement Test! And June hasn't even started!! Save the date: June 20th is our Grade 6 Farewell at 12:45 pm! Students are asked to wear their very best for the farewell.

In Language Arts, we are reading an excellent novel called "Touching Spirit Bear," that features Cole Matthes, an angry juvenile delinquent who finds himself sentenced to banishment to an Alaskan island as part of Indigenous restitutional justice. We will be starting a Land Literacy unit and researching how historical and current cultures use the land, creating landmarks and historical sites to communicate their values. We are also reading as much as possible with Reading: Part II of our PAT quickly approaching.

In **Mathematics**, we are in the thick of our Geometry unit and using formulas to find the area of triangles, parallelograms, and trapezoids. We are also learning about the unique properties of triangles, finding missing angles, and classifying triangles by angles: acute, obtuse and right; then classifying triangles by sides: equilateral, isosceles and scalene. Volume is our next topic as students come to understand fluid metric measurement volume concepts.



In <u>Social Studies</u>, we are finishing up the election process for provincial and federal elections in Canada. Our final unit is a study of Roman democracy and promises to be a fascinating study!

In our **<u>Science</u>** unit, we will be looking at climate change and how human activities are having an impact on the environment, animal habitats and human health.

Each part of the group is equally important, just like everything we pay attention to and repeat changes our brain and helps us to form new pathways and connections.


